Gross runs, passes for 214 yards, 5 touchdowns

WEST LIBERTY — Junior quarterback Stacy Gross ran and passed for 214 total yards and figured in five touchdowns to fuel a 42-0 offensive outburst as Mount Vernon blanked West Liberty, 55-0, in an Eastern Iowa Hawkeye Conference prep football finale Friday night.

Gross rushed six times for 107 yards and three TDs, and passed for two more scores on an identical 107 yards.

The Mustangs, 7-2 in the Eastern Iowa Hawkeye Conference and 7-2 overall, built a 42-0 halftime lead and held West Liberty to 85 total yards.

Gross ran for TDs of four, 64 and 10 yards. He completed 3 of 6 passes, including a 58-yarder to Tony Patrick and 22 yards to Scott Gross. Gross also hit a conversion pass to Doug West.

Other Mustang TDs came on runs of one yard by David Randall, three yards by Scott Gross and one yard by Brian Becker.

CENTRAL CITY — Scott McClure rushed for 238 yards on 22 carries and scored five touchdowns as Tri-Rivers Conference tri-champion Starmont stamped Central City. McClure scored on runs of 65, 60, 25, 5 and 5 yards.

Central City fumbled a field goal attempt on a fourth-and-goal after taking the opening kickoff the length of the field. Starmont's John Nus scooped the fumble and rambled 84 yards for a touchdown.

Central City closed to 7-6 on Mike Villari's 11-yard scoring pass to Mike Kramer.

Starmont's Randy Hamlett then picked off a Villari toss and returned it 24 yards to a touchdown to make the score 14-6. Starmont led 35-14 at the half and 56-14 after three quarters.

Central City's Randy Schulte caught 14 passes for 154 yards, two touchdowns and a two-point conversion. Villari completed 25 of 49 passes for 239 yards and three touchdowns. He was also intercepted three times.

Starmont finished 7-1 in the Tri-Rivers, 8-1 overall. Central City bowed out 1-7, 1-8.

The other conference tri-champs, Center Point and East Buchanan, played in a Class 1A playoff game Thursday. Center Point won, 18-12.


OELWEIN — Tony Merfeld scored his second touchdown of the night in overtime as Independence finished the season at 4-5.

■ **BASEBALL** — Presidential spokesman Larry Speakes said Thursday he would apologize to the mayor of New York for a "facetious remark" about the World Champion New York Mets that he said was taken out of context. The Mets, who won the World Series Monday with an 8-5 victory over Boston, were invited by President Reagan to the White House. In announcing the invitation, Speakes said "I hope they don't do to the White House what they did to Rusty's Restaurant in New York." Speakes was referring to damage done after Game 7 to the restaurant owned by former Met Rusty Staub. Speakes later said he knew the Mets were not present at the celebration and added, "If the World Champion New York Mets want to tear up the White House, they can. It's theirs."

Successful surgery has been performed on Red Sox first baseman Bill Buckner, pitcher Jeff Sellers and first base coach Walt Hrinak, the club said Thursday. The team announced the operations after earlier reporting that right fielder Dwight Evans and pitcher Tom Seaver had small tears in knee cartilage removed. Buckner had two large chips in his left ankle and many spurs in his left foot removed. . . . St. Louis Friday signed first baseman Jack Clark to a one-year contract. No terms were disclosed. Clark missed more than half the 1986 season after undergoing surgery in June for a torn metacarpal on his right hand. . . . An out-of-court agreement has been worked out that ends Boston pitcher Dennis "Oil Can" Boyd's problems with Chelsea police. City attorneys dropped the case Thursday before a show cause hearing was to be held to determine if charges should be brought against Boyd in connection with an alleged altercation with police detectives who had searched him for drugs. . . . Four players, including pitcher Vern Ruhle of the AL West champion California Angels, declared for free agency Friday. Joining Ruhle were Chicago Cubs infielder Chris Speier, Milwaukee catcher-outfielder Charlie Moore and Toronto catcher Buck Martinez.

■ **COLLEGE BASKETBALL** — Kentucky 6-foot-7 forward Todd Ziegler was suspended from the team Friday following his arrest on a shoplifting charge, Coach Eddie Sutton said. . . . The Maryland basketball team will be missing its only senior starter when the season begins next month. Senior guard Keith Gatlin is ineligible to play this season. Junior forward Derrick Lewis said he is considering transferring to another school or sitting out the season.

■ **MISC.** — Third-string quarterback Tom Flick, who kept his career alive through five years of discouragement, gets his first NFL start Sunday, just as Al Saunders makes his head coaching debut for the San Diego Chargers. Injuries to San Diego's top two quarterbacks thrust Flick, 28, into the lineup to face the Kansas City Chiefs. Saunders was assistant head coach before taking over for Don Coryell, who resigned Wednesday. . . . The Houston Rockets have placed 7-foot-4 forward Ralph Sampson on the injured list. Sampson, who suffered a sprained ankle during the exhibition season, must miss five games. . . . Spain's star golfer, Seve Ballesteros, allegedly punched a photographer and scuffled with another Friday during a visit to a Spanish Mediterranean island. Associated Press

Fuller to start at QB for Bears vs. Rams

CHICAGO (AP) — Chicago Bears quarterback Steve Fuller will start against the Los Angeles Rams Monday night, a team spokesman said Friday.

Quarterback Jim McMahon will be dressed and ready to go, said Bears spokesman Bryan Harlan. Said Harlan, "Jim hasn't thrown in the last two days and his shoulder is still bothering him."

McMahon has missed three games this season due to injuries. Defensive end Richard Dent will start against the Rams, Harlan said.

Dent was fined an undisclosed sum Thursday for leaving Wednesday's practice early without notifying Coach Mike Ditka. Dent was suffering Wednesday from a mild case of pleurisy, an inflammation in the lining of the lungs, and had complained of flu-like symptoms. Trainer Fred Caito said he and Dent mutually agreed Dent would leave early.

Dent practiced Thursday and Friday, Harlan said.

Another injured player, Walter Payton, didn't practice Wednesday or Thursday, but he was back at practice Friday and will start against the Rams, Harlan said.

The NFL team has not decided if it will activate newly acquired quarterback Doug Flutie for Monday's game. The former Heisman Trophy winner says he is still confused by the Bears offense.

"I think he could play, but that would be unfair to him," Ditka said. "That's all we'd have to do is put him out there and things not go right for him."

Two others whose play had been in doubt, linebacker Mike Singletary and fullback Matt Suhey, were at practice Friday and will start against the Rams, Harlan said.

Singletary missed last week's game with a groin injury and Suhey suffered a rib injury.

North Scott ousts Kennedy at state

DES MOINES — Led by Tracy Graham, North Scott eliminated Cedar Rapids Kennedy from the Class 2A high school state volleyball tournament Friday at Dowling.

Defending state champ and No. 1-ranked North Scott improved to 34-1-2 with a 15-12, 15-8, 15-6 win over the Cougars.

North Scott now faces unranked Des Moines Hoover, which downed No. 13 Fairfield 10-15, 15-4, 15-10 and 15-4.

Kennedy ended its season with a 27-9-5 match record and a 74-35 game mark.

"We were too tentative in our hitting," Kennedy assistant coach Randy Krejci said. "North Scott will be awfully tough to beat. Not only because of Graham, but because of their all-around hitting."

Kennedy's effort was paced by Kristy Craig, Lisa Smith and Tina Naaktgeboren. Craig had 11 aces spikes, Smith eight. Naaktgeboren had 22 ace sets and was perfect on 11 serves, giving her 474 consecutive perfect serves this season. That total is believed to be a state record, according to Krejci.

Meanwhile, defending Class 1A champ Dike, ranked fourth, beat

Correctionville Eastwood 15-4, 15-3, 13-15 and 15-2 and will play in today's semifinal against No. 9 George, which swept Waukee 15-1, 15-3 and 15-11.

The semifinals and finals will be played at West Des Moines Dowling High School. The 2A semifinals begin at 11 a.m. while the 1A semis get started at 2:30 p.m. Championship matches start at 6 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., respectively.

In earlier quarterfinal matches Friday, No. 1 Camanche came away with a hardfought victory over No. 12 Mediapolis in Class 1A. Mediapolis won two of the first three matches, 15-13, 5-15

and 15-13, before the Indians rallied behind the spiking of Barb Willis and Alysia Gonzales, winning the final two matches 15-2 and 15-8.

Camanche will play Algona in the 1A semifinal. Algona whipped Clarinda 8-15, 15-5, 15-7 and 15-3 to advance.

In 2A, 1985 runner-up Dubuque Wahlert defeated Sioux City North 15-4, 12-15, 15-11 and 15-3 for the right to play Waterloo West in the semifinal. West beat Fort Dodge 15-8, 8-15, 12-15, 15-10 and 15-7 for the right to advance.

Bjornsen, who played both ways as a linebacker and running back, scored two touchdowns on a 1-yard run and a 64-yard pass from quarterback Shaw. He also recorded 10 solo tackles to break a single-season Wash record. Bjornsen finished with 85 solos for the year, bettering the 82 total Kevin Tann wound up making a year ago.

"YOU BET I'M glad we lined up a game this week," Bjornsen smiled. "Hey, I wouldn't have gotten the record."

Still, he couldn't decide whether he preferred defense or offense.

"I love to run with the ball," Bjornsen explained, "but I love to hit people, too. Hopefully I'll be able to play somewhere next year."

Shaw, who completed 6 of 14 passes for 143 yards, won't be a Warrior next year either. But he

predicted big things for the '87 season.

"This team should be excellent next year," said Shaw, who also connected with Anthony Beshears for a 20-yard touchdown. "There are a lot of good juniors coming back. It would be nice to return next season, but that's just the way things work."

"YOU KNOW, OUR line was inexperienced coming into the season, and I needed some polishing myself," said Shaw, a scapegoat during the Warriors' 0-3 start. "But they really toughened up the second half of the season. Now, they've got the experience. They'll be awfully good next year."

Bjornsen's 1-yard TD run capped a 51-drive with 4:48 remaining in the first quarter. Shaw added his touchdown passes to Bjornsen and

Beshears in the second frame as Wash built a 26-6 lead by halftime.

Richard Powell's 45-yard TD run with 14 seconds to go before intermission helped Central avoid a

shutout. The Chargers finished 0-9.

Wash's Nathan Brooks closed out the scoring with an 8-yard touchdown burst with 4:32 left to play in the third quarter.
