Cougars smash Grayhounds, 77-13

CEDAR RAPIDS — Arguably the best player in Cedar Rapids Kennedy football history roamed the Cougars sideline last night at Kingston Stadium.

Shaun Beyer did just about everything last season in helping Kennedy make it to the Class 4A state championship game. You couldn't have blamed Cougars Coach Brian White for maybe trying to sneak the University of Iowa redshirt into his team's district opener against Burlington.

Not that he was needed. He wasn't.

Kennedy scored five touchdowns each in the first and second quarters to put up 70 — yes, 70 — points in an eventual 77-13 victory. The point total is believed to be a school record.

"It was crazy," Kennedy's Ki Jenkins said. "We just went out there and played our game. Coach told us we were going to run these four plays, and we're going to execute them. We're going to run it, we're going to block it and get some yards. We have some athletes, and we knew what we needed to do."

"We were just more focused on fixing some of the problems we've had in the past: being able to run the ball, O-line

continuity, being able to throw the ball," White said. "We really wanted to work on our pass game tonight. Doing those types of things, we felt like we would have the opportunity to move the ball a little bit.

Watching them on film, they came in here with two wins, just like us. We thought we'd be in for a fight."

Rizaiha Maide rushed for three TDs, Nick Duehr had two touchdown runs and a TD reception, and Jenkins had touchdowns on a reception and punt return. Throw defensive back Terrell Jordan's pick-six and a Garrett Kubovec score, and there are your 10 first-half Cougars touchdowns.

Backup running back Lorenzo Burnett scored on a 15-yard run to open the third quarter for Kennedy (3-2). Sophomore KeyShawn Allers had a game-high 128 yards in a reserve role.

Give it up to an obviously improving line of Jackson Coker, Parker Maxwell, Austin Maus, Matt Murphy and James Vega. Kennedy finished with 458 yards rushing, averaging over 11 per run.

White intentionally took delay of game penalties in the final five minutes with his team inside the 10-yard line, so it wouldn't score more.

"Our line is doing better," Jenkins said. "That's what happens when you do more work."
