



Brian White prepped at Linn-Mar in the late 80's where he played under Hall of Fame coach Greg Purnell. There he participated in the Iowa High School Playoffs in each of his varsity years. In 1993 he received his undergraduate degree from Coe College in Cedar Rapids. White was a four year letter winner on the Kohawk football team and was a part of multiple conference championships and a trip to the NCAA Playoffs. After a short stint in the private sector Brian accepted his first coaching job at Cedar Rapids Washington as a varsity football coach eventually becoming the defensive coordinator. In 11 seasons at Washington he was part of four playoff teams and a state runner-up finish in 2003. Brian also served as an assistant track and field coach, baseball coach and strength coach.

In 2006 White moved across town to Cedar Rapids Kennedy where he served as the Defensive Coordinator. In that role he was part of 9 consecutive playoff teams. In 2010 White was named the *Iowa Football Coaches Association 4A Assistant Coach of the Year*. In addition to his football duties in 2012 White accepted the head coaching position for the Kennedy boys track and field program. In just 3 years he turned the program into one of the top programs in the state. In 2013 his team finished 4th overall at the state track meet. In 2014 the Kennedy track team won a District Championship and finished 3rd at the state track meet which is the highest finish in school history. He was named both 2013 & 2014 *Cedar Rapids Metro Track Coach of the Year*.

White took over the Kennedy football program in 2014. In his first year the team went 3-8 in a rebuilding year that included a first round playoff win. In 2015 he guided his Kennedy football team to its first undefeated regular season in school history. He also led his team to the State Championship game for the first time in school history and finished as 2015 State Runner-Up. The Kennedy football team ended the season 13-1 winning the 4A District 5 Championship. The 2015 Cougars broke 18 school records on the season and ended up with 7 All-State players including the 4A captain. Brian was named the *2015 Iowa Football Coaches Association Coach of the Year*, *2015 4A District 5 Coach of the Year* and the *2015 Cedar Rapids Metro Coach of the Year*. He will also be an assistant coach for the north in the *2016 Shrine Bowl* game.

Brian is fortunate to have a supportive wife Debbie and three sons BJ (15), Max (13) and Calvin (9) at home who are all very active in multiple sports.
