

Jamey Parker – Assistant Coach, Freshmen



Jamey Parker is entering his first season at Kennedy as an Assistant Coach on the Freshmen team. A 1991 Kennedy alum, Parker played Offensive and Defensive Line at Kennedy. Parker played alongside Head Freshmen Coach Pat Cory on the most successful season in Kennedy football history to that point, going 8-2 as seniors, with both losses to crosstown rival Linn Mar; the second coming in the first round of the Class 4A playoffs. That was the first playoff berth in school history. Parker earned All-State honors and was named Best Blocker on his team.

After graduation, Parker continued his football career at NW Missouri State where he lettered for two seasons as a Guard. He then transferred to Wartburg College and was a two-year starter. While at Wartburg he played on teams that qualified for the NCAA Division III playoffs in 1993 and 1994, advancing to the quarterfinals in 1994. He was named All-Iowa Conference and Division III All-American in 1993 and 1994. He received a degree in Sociology from Wartburg.

Parker began his coaching career in 1995 as a student assistant at Wartburg coaching offensive linemen alongside Coach Don Erusha. He also coached for five seasons at various levels for Coach Jerry Schultz in the Estherville-Lincoln Central program.

Parker works for NextEra Energy Duane Arnold Energy Center. He resides in Hiawatha with his wife, Angie, and son Cade, and daughters Addison and Aubrey.
